PRESBYTERY THEOLOGICAL TASK FORCE GUIDELINES CONSIDERING THE CONFESSIONS

- 1. The national Theological Task Force will meet with and explain the role and function of the Presbytery Theological Task Force.
- 2. Each Presbytery Theological Task Force is asked to coordinate, stimulate, and encourage both Presbytery and local congregations to engage with the resource material entitled *Considering the Confessions*.
- 3. Each Presbytery Theological Task Force is to become familiar with the current *Book of Confessions*, the ECO's Essential Tenets, the material entitled *Considering the Confessions*, and the guidelines provided for Sessions.
- 4. The Presbytery Theological Task Force is to be a resource for local congregations, and to coordinate and supervise the Presbytery's role in *Considering the Confessions*.
- 5. The Presbytery Theological Task Force is to encourage each church to appoint a team from Session to explore in detail the resource material entitled *Considering the Confessions* and to read through and become familiar with our current *Book of Confessions*. The content of our *Book of Confessions* is:
 - The Nicene Creed
 - The Apostles' Creed
 - The Scot's Confession
 - The Heidelberg Catechism
 - The Second Helvetic Confession
 - The Westminster Confession
 - The Westminster Larger Catechism
 - The Westminster Shorter Catechism
 - The Theological Declaration of Barmen
 - The Confession of 1967
 - The Brief Statement of Faith
- 6. The Presbytery Theological Task Force is to report on its responsibilities to the Presbytery, and in collaboration with Sessions, consider Confessional overtures to the Presbytery and Synod.
