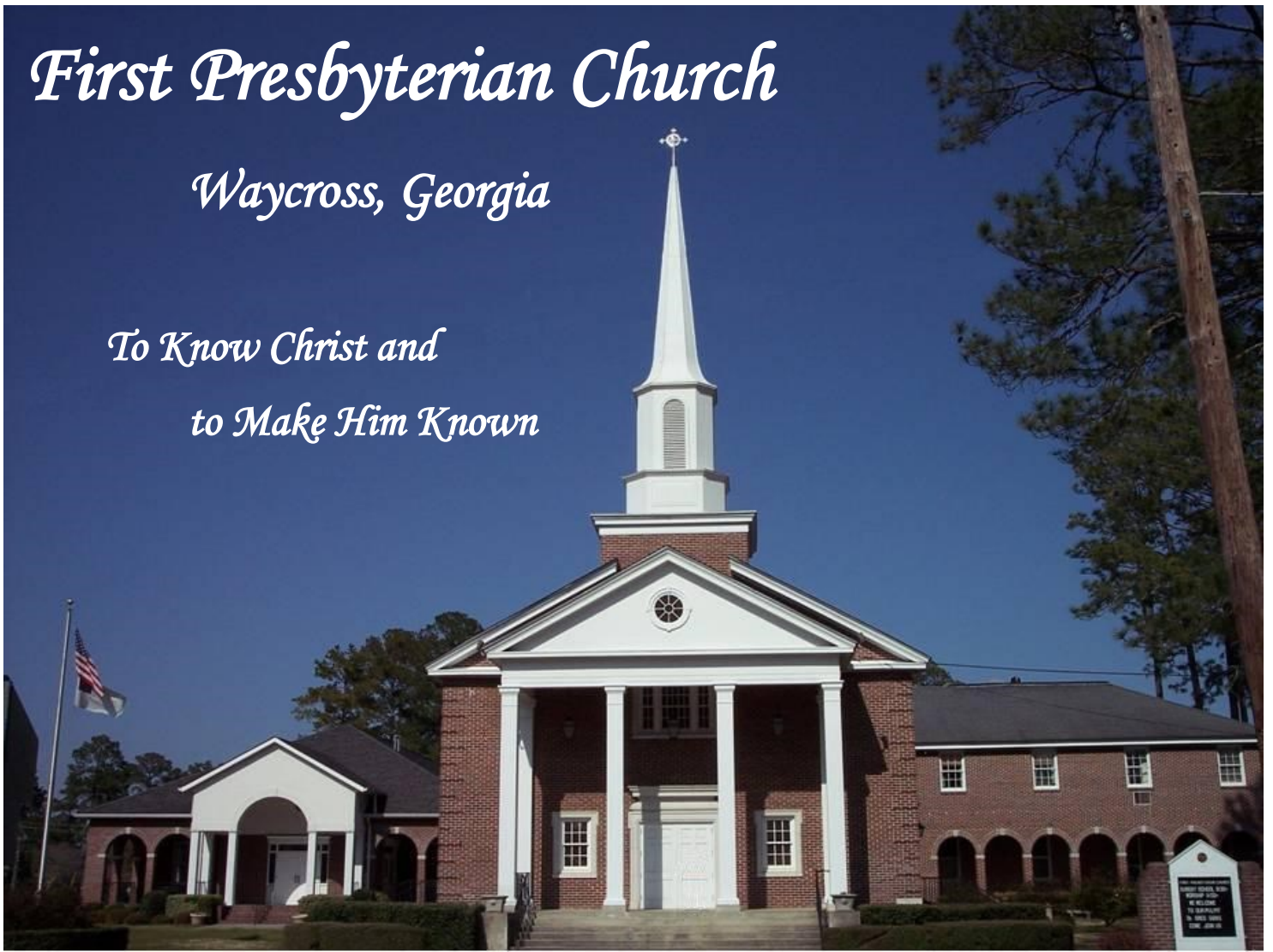

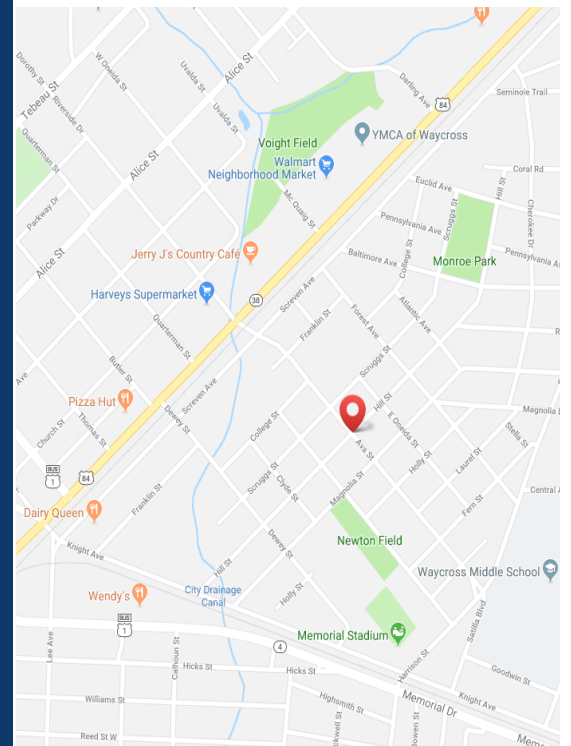

Jesus-shaped Identity:

We believe Jesus Christ must be at the center of our lives and making disciples of Jesus at the core of our ministry.

We believe in calling people to the core of what it means to be followers of Jesus – what “mere Christianity” is and does – and not fixate on the boundaries.

History of First Presbyterian Church, Waycross, Georgia

Early settlers to the area of Waycross brought more than just the drive and determination to wrest a living from the abundant timber and other resources. They brought strong family values and a love of God. So it is no surprise that worship services occurred in this community when it was barely a crossroads. Prior to 1887 the communal gathering place of worship was the Union Church, built by the joint financial efforts of several denominations, where a visiting Methodist and/or Baptist preacher held services that everyone attended. There was also a fledgling Sunday School held in the home of Mrs. Sarah Hicks Williams that addressed the importance of religious training. Mrs. Williams, a northern import by marriage, longed for having a regular preacher and attending an orderly religious service, and influenced the early church development.

"...on the evening of Thursday, March 4th, [1887] a meeting of all persons desiring to unite themselves to constitute a Presbyterian Church was called..." thus read part of the minutes of the founding of this Presbyterian Church. 13 individuals met at the Ware County Courthouse for this formative meeting. The Rev. John Way Quarterman served as the founding pastor, some of his descendants continue to worship with us today.

Within two years construction began on a physical structure [across town, on Williams Street, near the current First United Methodist Church] only to be blown down by a severe storm. It was rebuilt and finally ready for use in 1891. Individuals donated land, communion services, offering plates, baptismal fonts and the majority of the furnishings for this first church

Construction of the current facility began in 1951, with a Service of Dedication for the Education Building on September 21, 1952. The sanctuary was completed seven years later, with the first worship service conducted on December 14, 1958. Our social hall was added in 1998 with some renovation in the educational building as well.

In 2017 we completed the transition from the PCUSA denomination to the Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians (ECO). The process was long and challenging, physically and spiritually. The surrounding worshipping communities were very supportive. The congregation persevered and we are now eager to integrate into ECO and develop ministry relationships with our new ECO brothers and sisters.

The real life of this church revolves around the people. They may have been 13 in number when they began, but they were soon joined by a steady stream of faithful families each contributing their gifts for ministry to the community and to each other. Through the decades, this body of Christ has welcomed into its life of preaching, teaching, worship, fellowship and service 17 pastors, many interim pastors and interns, numerous gifted musicians and talented support staff, and several hundred families and individuals. Whether their stay was short or long in duration, each contributed to the total witness of the church at that moment. 131 years later, it is still the life witness of each member of this body that effects making Christ known among ourselves, to Waycross, and to the world.
